Family-driven means families have a primary decision making role in the care of their own children as well as policies and procedures governing care for all children in their communities states, tribes, territories and nation. ²

Youth-guided means young people have the right to be empowered, educated, and given a decision making role in the care of their own lives as well as policies and procedures governing the care of all youth in the community, state and nation. ³
