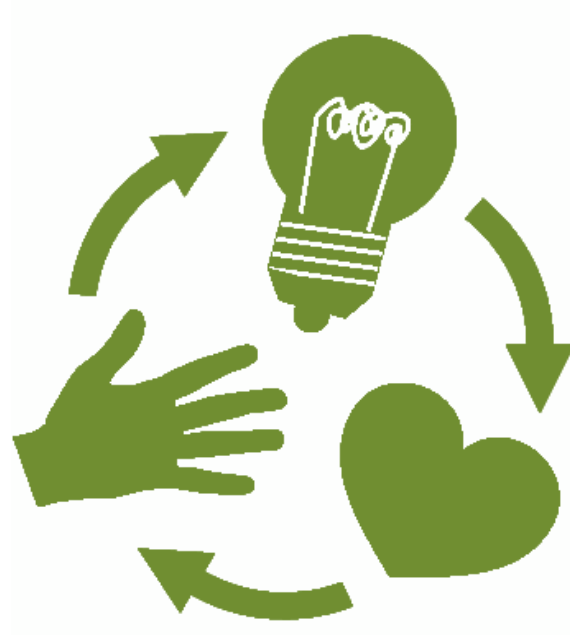

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1. Align child-serving systems toward common goals and outcomes
2. Implement family-driven, youth-guided, culturally and linguistically competent services and systems
3. Improve services and outcomes for children and youth with serious and complex behavioral health needs and their families
4. Realign financing streams to better invest resources for behavioral health services and supports for children, youth, and families
5. Create a sustainable infrastructure to provide on-going training in the System of Care approach, effective services, and other workforce development strategies
6. Identify emotional and behavioral health challenges and needs at earlier ages and at earlier stages
7. Maximize opportunities for integration of mental health and substance use prevention, intervention, and treatment with primary care
8. Measure outcomes of implementing improved services that are family-driven, youth-guided, and culturally and linguistically competent
9. Maximize support for implementing family driven, youth-guided, culturally and linguistically competent systems and services

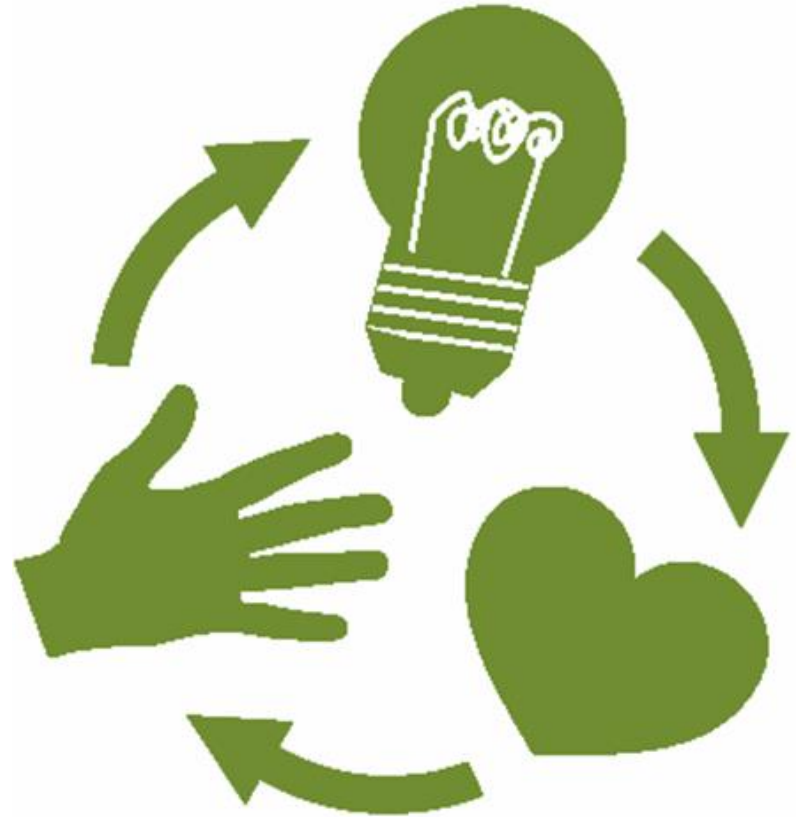
- System of care leadership legislation (SB534)
