Parental Rights and Responsibilities

- Participate in all IEP meetings
- 10 day meeting notice
- Provided interpreter or other supports
- 5 days access to material
- Request an IEP Team meeting





Parental Rights and Responsibilities

- Written Prior Notice
- Give, withhold, revoke written consent
- Access their child's educational records
- Access formal dispute resolution options





Referral to Consider Special Education

- Anyone, including parent may refer
- Write a letter dated
- Keep a copy
- Parent notified in writing immediately





Decision Making Meeting (Disposition of Referral)

- Must meet within 15 calendar days
- Can needs be met through regular education services
- Or should child be evaluated
- Written parental permission to evaluate





Evaluation

- What additional testing is needed
- Written permission from the parent
- Must be completed within 45 days
- One-time 15 day extension
- May request an independent evaluation





Eligibility

- Based on evaluation results
- Eligibility categories
- Must negatively impact educational and functional performance
- And require specialized instruction





Development of the Individualized Education Program (IEP)

- Begin development within 30 days
- 14 days to make a decision
- Agree, agree with exceptions, disagree
- Always ask for another meeting





Determination of Educational Placement

- After IEP signed
- Continuum of settings
- Must be Least Restrictive Environment
- In regular classroom unless needs cannot be met





Monitoring

- IEP includes progress monitoring
- How and when progress reported
- Yearly meeting to review/revise
- Re-evaluation every 3 years
